Crime and its norms and beliefs are then transmitted from one generation to the next through social interaction of young juveniles with older criminals With the general absence of supervision and community social control in the neighborhood this happens fairly easily Crime is merely a normal response to the disorganized social

Social Control Theory: Hirschi Travis Hirschi developed social control theory to explain the occurrence of deviance According to social control theory, deviance occurs when a person's (or group's) attachment to social bonds is weakened Most of the time people internalize social norms because of their attachments to others
