Reading to children at age 4-5 every day has a significant positive effect on their reading skills and cognitive skills (ie, language and literacy, numeracy and cognition) later in life o Reading to children 3-5 days per week (compared to 2 or less) has the same effect on the child's reading skills at age 4-5 as being six months older
