Using the Incredible 5-Point Scale 19 Student demonstrates a behavior or misinterprets a social situation. Define a specific behavior or emotion. Break the behavior into 5 parts/levels & define the behavior at each number. Discuss with the student when it is appropriate to be at each place on the scale. Write a story at the child's level and share in 1-on-1 teaching.
