### **Trauma Open Fracture ABX Clinical Practice Management ...**

MANAGEMENT OF OPEN FRACTURES: 1 Sterile dressing with normal saline-soaked gauze 2 Irrigation of gross contamination at discretion of the ORTHO attending 3 IV ABX should be given within 1 hour of ED arrival ABX selection is outlined in Table 1 4 Open fractures should be transferred to

the OR on an urgent basis (within 24 hours) 5

### **Clinical Practice Management Guidelines**

Open Fracture Management I Classification of Open Fractures (Gustilo Classification) Type I: Open fracture with a skin wound <1 cm in length and clean Type II: Open fracture with a laceration >1 cm in length without extensive soft tissue damage, flaps, or avulsions Type III: Open segmental fracture with >10 cm wound with extensive soft

### **Treatment principles in the management of open fractures**

Type II fractures, and to 227% (45/198) of Type III fractures These data are similar to a more recent study on the treatment of open tibia fractures Antibiotic treatment with open fracture management should be automatic with early administration being paramount [Table 3], ideally within 3 h of injury

couraged for the management of open fractures There is currently controversy with regard to the specific antibiotic agent(s) to be given after open fracture While some have recommended treating all open fractures with a combination of a first-generation cephalosporin and an amino-glycoside<sup>20</sup>, others have advocated monotherapy with a first-

### **Controversies in the Management of Open Fractures**

The Gustilo and Anderson classification of open fractures [5, 7], though recognized to have poor intra-observer reliability [24, 25], helps prognostication and management planning Most open fractures (50-75%) are contaminated (ie will have a positive culture) prior to initial debridement [5, 19, 26]

### **ACS TQIP**

overlying open fractures should be closed at the time of initial debridement z Soft tissue coverage should be completed within seven days of injury for open fractures associated with wounds requiring skin grafting or soft tissue transfers Open fractures occur when a fractured bone is exposed through a disruption of the skin and subcutaneous
