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Seminar Primary glomerulonephritides

Establishment of whether a glomerulonephritis is primary or secondary is key in the work-up of a suspected glomerulonephritis, because secondary glomerulo-nephritis often necessitates treatment of the underlying disorder rather than treatment for the glomerulonephritis Adequate diagnostic assessment should be considered

MEMBRANOUS NEPHROPATHY

Secondary cause in 20-60% of adults - depending on region and endemic diseases (68% in China; 20% in France and 38% in USA ! Children with MN have a higher likelihood to have Secondary MN (mainly auto-immune disease) ! Neoplasia accounts for 3-10% of Secondary MN, but as much as 25% of cases in subjects over 60 years of age !

Histomorphological and clinical study of primary and ...

Immune processes underlie most cases of primary GN, but they are also present in many secondary events in the glomerulus Therefore, the division of etiopathologic mechanisms of glomerulopathy is reduced to immunological and non-immunological 1 Glomerular lesion is clinically expressed with a relatively small number of signs and symptoms

Renal impairment in systemic diseases

MPA: clinical signs Prodromal phase of several months with constitutional symptoms, including polymyalgia Macroscopic hematuria, edema, oliguria (symptoms of glomerulonephritis) Renal involvement >80% Body weight loss >70% Skin lesions >60% • Palpable purpura 41% & Livedo reticularis 12% Neurologic involvement 60% Fever 55%

Glomerulonephritis Associated With Inflammatory Bowel ...

primary sclerosing cholangitis and rapidly progressive glomerulonephritis Findings on immunofluorescence microscopy and electron microscopy

suggested that glomerular injury occurred secondary to the deposition of circulating immune complexes. Renal disease responded to treatment with corticosteroids.
