#### **Essential Reading Strategies for the Struggling Reader**

Fluent reading consists of three components: rate, accuracy, and prosody (prosody refers to intonation, stress, and pauses) the main goal of fluent reading practice is to provide students with opportunities to read accurately and quickly if they are reading only words, and/or with appropriate expression if they are reading connected text

#### **Teaching Sight Words - Ohio Department of Education**

Kilpatrick concurs: Students on track for reading at end of 2nd grade, need to encounter a new word unfamiliar word 1-4 times and they have it \ Reading words by sight reduces the number of times decoding is necessary Affects fluency and enables more cognitive deskpace to be used for comprehension \

#### **Teaching Sight Words According to Science**

Teaching Smarter, Not Harder Once students have created personal lexicons, they no longer need to rely solely on the sound-spelling correspondences However, these correspondences are crucial at the beginning stages of reading AND whenever students encounter new and unfamiliar words
