#### **Nitrous Oxide Administration PURPOSE/SCOPE POLICY ...**

Post Administration •Turn off Nitrous oxide and maintain face mask on the patient delivering 100% oxygen for 3-5 minutes •Document any changes in nitrous concentration, patient response, full set of vital signs, start and stop times, recovery time, adverse effects of sedation and

Nitrous oxide administration for anxiolysis and analgesia has an excellent safety record The intent of administering nitrous oxide is to achieve minimal sedation in the outpatient setting, anxiolytic/analgesia with maternal self-administration in the labor and delivery

during nitrous oxide administration Chronic or prolonged exposure to nitrous waste gas in a closed environment (eg work area) can lead to impairment of Vitamin B12 metabolism This can lead to megaloblastic anemia in healthy patients after 12 hrs of continuous exposure to 50% nitrous Patients with pre-existing Vitamin

Oct 15, 2014 · The administration of enteral drugs exceeding the maximum recommended dose during a single appointment is considered to be moderate sedation and the moderate sedation guidelines apply Nitrous oxide/oxygen when used in combination with sedative agent(s) may produce minimal, moderate, deep sedation or general anesthesia
